## Minutes – Annual Meeting November 9, 2025

The annual meeting was called to order by President Alex Prizgintas with the Pledge of Allegiance and a Moment of Silence. 2025 Officers and Trustees present: Alex Prizgintas, Leslie Rose, Walt Stanfield Jr., Bill Doyle, Bob McCue, Robert Anzalone, Neil Crouse, Millicent Treloar, Viktor Prizgintas, Arlene Maher; 10 of 13, a quorum. June Menkens, deceased in August 2025, leaves a vacant 14<sup>th</sup> position.

Alex called for deferring the acceptance of the September 20, 2025 meeting minutes and Treasurer's report. Motioned by Bill Doyle, seconded by Leslie Rose; approved by all in membership vote.

Alex announced the availability of the 2026 Calendar featuring the history of Woodbury's First Responders, with a suggested donation of \$15. He reminded everyone about the Train Show on Sunday, December 7, 2025. Robin Crouse announced a Climate Smart Committee website, [VoicesofWoodbury.com](http://VoicesofWoodbury.com), survey of Woodbury residents regarding their "wants" for open spaces.
